## EDITORIAL: SPECIAL VOLUME WORKING GROUP ON THEORETICAL RESEARCH IN BEHAVIOR ANALYSIS

Brazil is home of one of the largest communities of behavior analysts. It is a common cultural feature of this community (at least in comparison to other countries) to have members dedicated to do theoretical research. The Working Group on Theoretical Research in Behavior Analysis is formed by 21 Brazilian behavior analysts, all Ph.Ds. with positions in Brazilian universities, who conduct exclusively (or mostly) theoretical research: i.e., research on conceptual, epistemological, ontological, historical, ethical, and political issues related to behavior analysis. The articles published in this volume have at least one author who is member of this working group.

Volume 51 is the fourth I helped to put together as editor of *Behavior and Philosophy*, and I'm thrilled that this one served as an outlet for the work being done in Brazil by the members of the Working Group on Theoretical Research in Behavior Analysis.
