Our [18th Annual Conference on Autism: Research-Based Solutions](#) will again be held as a hybrid in-person and online event this year. We are offering you an opportunity to present your poster to our attendees and speakers — a channel to disseminate your empirically-based ABA research!

Posters will be presented either in-person or virtually. In-person presentations are highly encouraged, but not required. Virtual presenters should prepare a short, 2-minute video recording highlighting the methods, results, and future directions of their projects that will be presented between speaker sessions.

Submission instructions to apply for a poster presentation:

1. Name(s) List all co-authors, affiliation, credentials, and indicate the presenting author with an *
2. Email Address(s)
3. Affiliation (University/Organization)
4. Title of poster
5. Primary Area of study (e.g. Animal behavior, autism, behavioral pharmacology, clinical, community, social, or ethical issues, developmental disabilities, human development, experimental analysis of behavior, education/special education and school counseling. Organizational behavior management, practice, teaching applied behavior analysis, theoretical, philosophical, or conceptual issues, or verbal behavior.)
6. 150-word abstract
7. Figure (graph, schematic, etc.) or table showing your data or conceptual analysis

Accepted poster instructions:

Once your poster has been accepted, you will need to electronically submit (2) important files:

1. *An MP4 file where the presenter provides the audience with the following items (90 second limit):
 - a. A brief introduction
 - b. Organization affiliation (school or organization)
 - c. Title of research
 - d. Highlights of the research
2. The actual poster in a (1) slide PPTX presentation



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
